The monument spans 125 years in Threadneedle Park, Leadenhall but has now been returned to a site in Paternoster Square adjacent to Paul's Cathedral. The Company has helped to secure its return and has worked with other Companies to ensure that the small room above the arch was made suitable for occasional purposes. A generous financial contribution has helped meet the cost of the commissioned furniture in the Chamber.
